Race Mark Status Report

From ASMBYC

If you've ever been out racing, tried to round the mark and couldn't find it, only to learn later that it was missing, you know the importance of buoy maintenance.

In Santa Monica Bay, funding for these yellow spars comes from all clubs based on usage and is administered by ASMBYC. Until recently, the physical maintenance was handled by an independent committee, but it was recently brought back under the administration of ASMBYC and, in particular, Buoy Chair Roberto Cordero, ASMBYC Junior Staff Commodore.

Here is Roberto's update as of April 1:

- ◆ Marks A & D are on the dock and are ready to roll for Saturday morning (April 2) deployment.
- ◆ Mark AA – is complete and ready to assemble. All parts complete. DRYC will deploy this at the end of next week.
- ◆ Mark G – will be ready to deploy. In the latter part of next week, the diver and I will attach G mark to the old G Tackle so no new ground tackle is needed. But this needs bottom paint.
- ◆ Mark J – is awaiting the Poly. I'm expecting this Poly next week and then J Mark will also be ready to deploy. I have all other parts including anchor. DRYC will deploy.
- ◆ Mark U - just needs some minor fiberglass repair and paint (this is the spare aluminum one from CYC – probably the old T Mark) and needs a new 7/8" nut.
- ◆ Mark F - needs a barrel and foam so this needs a small team of people to finish (a couple of hours). F already has ground tackle so this can be assembled fast with a barrel. I will shoot for doing this a month from now and will need volunteers.

Per the above, 100% of the marks will be replaced soon. (You can keep track of ASMBYC's updates on Facebook at: <http://www.facebook.com/pages/Association-of-Santa-Monica-Bay-Yacht-Clubs/154825999430>)

Our thanks go out to Roberto and everyone who has helped make this happen. It's been a while since we've had all the marks in the water. Having a full complement of marks will certainly make life easier for our Race Committees and will help keep races fair and competitive.

Race News

2011 San Diego NOOD Regatta

I had always heard about the NOOD regattas, and so I was very glad to finally get an opportunity to participate. But, if you are like me, you are probably asking yourself, "Just what is a NOOD regatta, anyway?"

The acronym NOOD stands for "National Offshore One-Design". Currently in its 24th year, this nationwide regatta series is the only one of its kind. Each year the NOOD is held in a series of cities around the U.S. This year, some of the cities include San Diego, CA, Chicago, IL, Annapolis, MD, Marblehead, MA, and St. Petersburg, FL. The NOOD is geared toward the hard-core amateur racer, with classes made up of one-design boats. And in recent years, PHRF classes have been added.

When the race started two decades ago, it reflected the sailing scene of the time: a lot of offshore classes and big boats. Today it has a mix of big and small boats, and even dinghies, racing around the cans. Some of the classes represented in San Diego included: J/24s, 505s, I-14s, Beneteau 36.7s, Thistles, Etchells, and Catalina 36s.

My ride for the NOOD weekend was on the J/24 *Critter*. Our course was set outside the breakwater in the open ocean. Sharing our course were the J/80s, J/105s, Beneteau 36.7s and the Catalina 36s. Heading out to the start line, conditions seemed promising, with a nice little 10-knot breeze. But the wind fizzled as the day went on. On our first race, we finished our twice around, windward-leeward course in about 2 hours. The light winds continued into the second race, which was thankfully a shortened course. Then it was back to the barn to plot our strategy for the next day. There were rumors of a storm blowing in and big winds. We waited for conditions to materialize.

The following day brought just what the weatherman predicted. Winds were 18-20kts+, and the seas were filled with whitecaps and chop. The crew of *Critter* discovered a crack in the boom at the gooseneck fitting before we went out and it was decided that we had better sit these conditions out. On invitation from the skipper of *Take 5*, a J/24 from California Yacht Club, I hopped on-board and we set off to tackle the conditions. It was a wet and wild ride of drizzle, wind, and spray.

I was put in charge of the middle of the boat, minding the tweekers and the boomvang. Our first downwind run under spinnaker was manageable, if a little hairy, but on our second run a wave pushed the boat and she went into a broach. I quickly let go the vang and as the line ran away from me the boat stood back up. We were nearly at the finish, so we put the chute away and finished with the jib. However, conditions were deteriorating and, before the second race started, we decided to head back to the dock.

It was a fast ride back, and before long *Take 5* was up on her trailer and heading home. I found the entire experience quite satisfying—adventure, sailboat racing, and plenty of crew camaraderie packed into a two-day weekend. I look forward to future NOODs!

WSA is Recruiting Skippers for Linda Elias Memorial Women's One Design Regatta Entries

WSA of Santa Monica Bay intends to promote Women's Sailing and the Linda Elias Memorial Women's One Design (sponsored by the Long Beach Yacht Club and the Long Beach WSA), through seeking to maximize opportunities for participation in this event, by both existing members and potential members that may choose to join the WSA. Further information about the regatta can be obtained from www.lbyc.org. This year the regatta will be held October 22-23.

The WSA of SMB plans to budget funding for up to 50% of the cost for up to 2 entries to include boat charter and entry fee, which will be open to any qualified skipper to apply. Final decision on funding will be at the sole discretion of the board. The skipper and/or crew will need to fund the remaining balance of the boat charter and entry fees, the damage deposit and any incidentals.

Should only 1 boat qualify for funding, at the discretion of the board, the balance of the budgeted funds may be donated to an organization or cause which promotes women's sailing such as the Linda Elias Scholarship fund, which provides funding to qualified women skippers to participate in other sailing events. Should more than 2 qualified boats apply for funding, it will be at the discretion of the board to define selection criteria and decide which entries will receive funding.

Interested skippers must submit a written request, including the skipper's racing resume, to the WSA board to qualify for consideration of funding. Requests will be accepted beginning 30 March; no requests will be considered after 15 August. Only applications from current WSA members will be considered. More information about the WSA of SMB, including a membership application, can be found at www.wsasmb.org. Requests for funding can be mailed to The Women's Sailing Association of Santa Monica Bay, PO Box 10034, Marina del Rey CA, 90295.

The WSA board will evaluate requests based on the following factors: (a) The skipper's overall sailing experience. (b) The skipper's racing history in terms of number of races entered and overall record. (c) The skipper's ability to recruit and train crew.

Requests for funding will be reviewed at each month's board meeting (the 4th Tuesday of every month), beginning with the April board meeting. Exceptional candidates may be accepted for funding at any board meeting. Skippers accepted for funding will be notified on the 30th of that month. Requests that are not accepted at a monthly board meeting are held over to be reviewed in upcoming board meetings, along with any newly received requests.

The last possible date to submit a request for funding is 15 August, and the last review of requests will occur at the August board meeting. Should 2 skippers be selected

for funding prior to 15 August, however, no further applications will be accepted after their acceptance. Final authorization for funding from the WSA is contingent upon approval of the skipper(s) by the Long Beach Yacht Club Sailing Foundation, the organization administering control of the boats used in this regatta.


The skipper is entirely in charge of who will be on her crew, with the sole proviso that all crew members be members of the WSA at the time of the regatta. Skippers who have been accepted for funding by the WSA board will be announced to the general membership by email announcement, in the following month's newsletter and at the following month's general meeting (the second Tuesday of each month). WSA members are encouraged to contact skippers in order to seek a crew position.

WSA Skipper Spotlight Capt. Jeannea Jordan

Jeannea started sailing fourteen years ago and currently owns a Catalina 30 named *Chekkerrs*.

2010's Marilyn Butefish Award recipient, Jeannea has raced in the Sunset Series regatta and the WOW/WAH regattas for the past 5 years.
