Mark Your Calendars, Upcoming WSA Race Clinics

For many of us, the coming of the holidays means that we get really busy with family, friends, parties, and holiday get-togethers, and that often means that sailing falls on the wayside somewhat. I wanted to talk about some upcoming workshops in the next few months, so we can all have them in mind for the post-holiday season.

On January 14th is the annual WSA Race Clinic. We are still working on the theme, but it is looking like it will be about sail trim. Sail trim is one of those areas that you can tweak endlessly, and is so detail-oriented that it can really be a mystery to people. Small differences in sail shape and trim can make a big difference in how fast or slow a boat will go through the water. So if you happen to be one of those mystified by the nuances of sail trim, or you simply just want to learn more, attend our racing clinic on January 14th. More details will be upcoming on the website and through the WSA email lists.

On February 11th, WSA and Del Rey Yacht Club will be co-hosting a North U racing clinic. I'm sure everyone has heard of North Sails, one of the major sailmakers in the United States (and probably the world). North Sails is also dedicated to racing, and they have a line-up of rock star instructors who can give clinics on racing, and even cruising. The clinic we are having will be focused on the most current practices in racing trim and boat handling. These clinics are all-day affairs from 9am-4:30pm, and there is a cost. More details will upcoming once I can get flyers.

Here is a short bio on Steve LeMay, who will be teaching the North U racing clinic on February 11th at Del Rey Yacht Club:

Steve LeMay comes to us from Dallas, Texas. His experience in the J 80, J 105, Melges 32 and Mumm 30 class is extensive. Steve's campaign as trimmer on some of the leaders in these classes only enhances his teaching ability.

Steve has sailed and coached on several One Design, PHRF, IMS and IRC boats. More specifically, Steve helped write the original Melges 32 tuning guide with Harry Melges and Eric Hood formerly of North Sails Zenda.

- ◆ Numerous J105 victories on the boats *Hoss*, *Wet Leopard* and *Trickster*

- ◆ 4th at 2005 J80 Worlds in Falmouth, England. Top US boat

- ◆ 2002, 2005 and 2007 J 80 Southern Circuit champion team
- ◆ Extensive experience on the Melges 32 . Read Steve's article on the North Sails website
- ◆ Numerous national, state and local championship wins. Farr 40, IMS, PHRF and Beneteau 33.7's

Steve also enjoys teaching our cruising classes. Having spent several months as a live-aboard, he loves the cruising aspect of the sport. In his off time, Steve is a private hot air balloon pilot and a critical care paramedic.

If you don't have a rewards card, they are free - just ask at the register next time you shop.


