

Santa Cruz Island Cruise

I just returned from a fabulous adventure with the Women's Sailing Association of Santa Monica Bay. six of us sailed out of Marina del Rey on two boats at 4 am last Monday to Santa Cruz Island and anchored at Little Scorpion. Arrived in perfect time.

We picked out our spot and then some pretty fancy anchoring commenced. It wasn't long after the area had it's fill of boaters.

We enjoyed kayaking, adventures with the dingy, beautiful scenery, lots of wild life (Jeannea had eight sea

lions swimming around and under her kayak), fabulous star-filled skies, games, great meals, and good company.

On Thursday we hustled up as the winds picked up and we headed for Santa Barbara Harbor where we continued our adventure and were met by three more women who joined us there for our three night stay. We had our share of dining adventures, some went wine tasting, did a little kayaking, and walked about a bit as we enjoyed ourselves.

Sunday morning we sailed onto Ventura Harbor. We dined and laughed at the "Greek on the Harbor" that night before returning to Marina del Rey the next day. During our trip we saw a couple of whales, several large pods of dolphin, harbor seals, sea lions, an unidentified fish that kept jumping out of the water, a large assortment of birds, and encountered lots of flies by the rock at Little Scorpion.

Jeannea, Cloyd Milton, and Sam Wagner are all excellent skippers, fabulous instructors and very generous with their time, knowledge, and sailboats.

It has been a long time of being away from the water for me, I am so grateful to be back. Thank you for making this possible.

An Outstanding Cruise to Santa Cruz

Two boats, *Chekkerrs* and *Mad Madeline*, carried Maria Langford, Donna Haro, Jeannea Jordan, Carey Meredith, and Cloyd Milton through foggy seas to Little Scorpion Cove on Santa Cruz Island on September 2. Sam Wagner, long time

sailing buddy of Jeannea and Cloyd, crewed on *Mad Madeline*.

The boats anchored behind the two large rocks at the western end of the cove. These rocks provided excellent protection from wind and sea. They were also home to dozens of pelicans, sea gulls, and cormorants. These birds furnished the means of an early morning wake up call as flies tickled exposed skin.

The clear night sky was spectacular with the Milky Way and stars; a sight we don't see in the city. The wind did blow all through the night causing the rigging to sing. *Mad Madeline's* aft anchor dragged during the night, but caused no harm. In the morning, the anchor was reset. The cause was eel grass, which is plentiful in Scorpion.

Santa Cruz Island is famous for sea caves. Three kayakers carried explorers into coves and caves. One kayaker, Jeannea, was escorted by eight sea lions as she paddled along. Jumping into a kayak Carey saved a windblown cockpit cushion. This was her first kayaking experience.

We were joined for happy hour by a sunbathing seal as he floated belly up just inches from us, a most unusual experience. Sailors took turns on the mess deck serving delicious meals. A bartender kept busy at happy hour. Stories, jokes and Jeannea's Sobriety Test supplied evening entertainment.

Thursday we set sail for Santa Barbara. The wind was at 24 knots and breaking seas four to seven feet. Reefed sails were set and speeds up to 7 knots were reached. The boats and crews easily handled the conditions and a comfortable sail was enjoyed, our only one of the trip.

Carey left us in Santa Barbara and Maureen and Helen Ann McCarthy took her place. Mess hands were unwilling to cook so hungry sailors found it necessary to partake of the fine eateries on shore. No one seemed to complain of this lack of industry aboard our boats.

The kayakers were used to explore the marina and shoreline. Some crew members took advantage of our closeness to wine country and sallied forth to test the local grape.

Sunday, we sailed to Ventura. Jeannea's friend, Donna Peterson, Ventura West Marina's Harbor master, joined us for happy hour and then dinner at the Greek

restaurant. A pretty costumed dancing girl entertained us. She even pulled several of us to join her. And you know what? WSA has some good dancers.

Foggy conditions greeted us Monday morning, but it stayed just ahead of us and we chased the fog all the way home. Once the boats were tidied and the cars loaded a final happy hour ended a successful and enjoyable cruise.


